January - Some To Do's

January is here & we say goodbye to the last few freezing weeks. Hopefully, if the forecast rain allows, we can get back out and complete some of those winter tasks. So, here's some suggestions to think about.

- Sow rows of the super-hardy broad bean 'Aquadulce Claudia' or 'The Sutton'
 now if the ground is unfrozen. Use a cloche to protect seedlings and to warm
 the ground to speed up germination. Alternatively, sow your seed in trays on
 a sunny windowsill or in the greenhouse and try using a root training
 propagator to form a stronger root system
- Even if you are still harvesting last year's Leaks, don't forget to start 2023's harvest off using varieties 'Lyon' or 'Mussleburgh' this month
- The recent frosts will have 'enhanced' any Parsnips still in the ground so now is a suitable time to harvest a few
- Towards the end of the month when the weather and soil conditions allow, plant out soft fruit bushes. Spray all fruit trees and bushes with a garlic winter wash on a fine day; do not spray in frosty conditions
- It is also suitable time to start your Runner Bean trench for kitchen scraps
- January is a good month to continue with any plot maintenance and to clean/repair any tools that need it








Other Items

Allotment Waiting List – The waiting list continues to reduce and is currently at **52.** The Committee on behalf of Woodley Town Council suspended allotment viewings during December, these will restart in January.
