Allotment holiday planning

Plan for holiday time away from your allotment by watering well before leaving. Adding a thick mulch around plants will help to retain moisture. Sink plastic bottles, with small holes pierced in their sides, into the ground next to thirsty plants like courgette and squash/pumpkins and fill up with water. If hot dry weather is forecast then maybe ask a friendly neighbour to water some of your

Pick any crops that are ready so you don't return to crops that have rotted or become too woody. Courgettes will develop into huge marrows if left unpicked! Surplus crops could be donated to READIFOOD Bank – see page 4 for more details.

What a load of rubbish!

The committee would like to politely remind plot holders that they are responsible for the considerate removal of rubbish from their plots.



Green waste should be composted on site – simple bins can be made from pallets – look for examples around the site. When broken down, this material is a great source of mulch and can be added to beds to enrich the soil. It can also be taken home for composting. It can be put out for kerbside collection in purchased brown wheelie bins or bags from the library or Oakwood centre. It can also be taken to the local recycling centre in Reading or Bracknell. (Don't forget to book your time slot https://re3.fccenvironment.co.uk/site-facilities/).

Green waste should not be dumped on anywhere on site that is not part of your plot.

In recent weeks, the committee has been made aware of the dumping of non green waste around the site, including large pieces of carpet. It is unclear whether this is a plot holder or a member of the general public that has gained unauthorised access to our site. The committee would welcome any information about the dumping of any form of unwanted items, including green waste so we can all work together to try and maintain a safe and attractive place to allotment on.

Security – please ensure that you close and lock the gate when you enter or leave the site.

Bonfires – Bonfires are not permitted on site until 1st October 2023.

Speed limit – The maximum speed limit for all vehicles is 5 m.p.h – please help us to keep everyone safe and avoid damge to the roadways by maintaining this speed.
